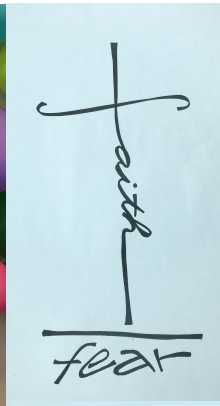
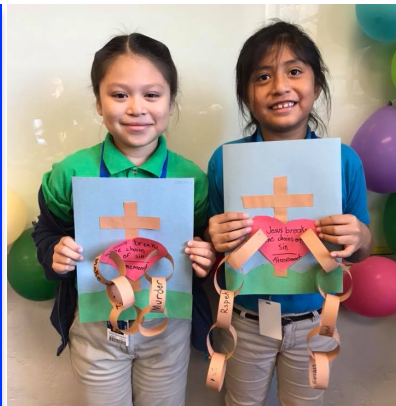

### ONECALL

REQUIRED: OneCall is used for global school events and emergencies and is sent to your cell phone. You are automatically signed up when you give TAA your telephone number at registration.

More than 100 high school students descended on Wewoka Woods Adventist Center for the Southwestern Union Conference's Leadership Camp in September. Seniors Garik Brown and Sarah Wagener and junior Sophia Fisher (pictured in a skit, left) attended on behalf of their classes. The weekend was full of mini-seminars for various school leaders including Student Association and Class Officers. The seminars were taught by Southwestern Adventist University S.A. officers who provided

# TAA JOINS TULSA REGIONAL CHAMBER



TAA recently joined the Tulsa Regional Chamber of Commerce and held a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Wednesday, September 29, 2018. TAA has been one of Tulsa's best-kept education secrets since it opened in 1916, but the school board wants to share our quality education with our community. "We want to connect with other educators and also businesses so that TAA can expand its mission to prepare students for heaven and earth. By meeting like-minded individuals and businesses, we can better serve our student body. The ribbon-cutting ceremony was followed by a reception and Oklahoma Conference officers mingled with the guests from area churches and local businesses.

To help TAA's community development, Mr. Lazarus applied for a grant from the Adventist organization Philanthropic Services for Institutions. TAA was granted \$46,000 over three years to use for advancing the "financial sustainability and accessibility of Adventist education" to the Tulsa area. TAA's responsibilities include a 100% commitment from teachers and school board members to donate monthly to the school; create a direct mail campaign; visit major donors; join a Chamber of Commerce; and many other activities vital to sustaining and improving TAA's viability. Caroline Fisher, TAA's Director for Institutional Advancement, is working on these projects with the support of Mr. Lazarus and the TAA school board, so please help us let Green Country know about us!
